LICENSE COSTS 2025

For Quebec residents:

Regular white-tailed deer permit for Zone 20 (Anticosti) is \$85.18. Small game permit is \$24.19 (small game season opens September 20, 2025).

For non-residents of Quebec:

Regular white-tailed deer permit for zone 20 (Anticosti) is \$460.82. Small game permit is \$112.57.

ESSENTIAL: SMALL COMMUNICATION DEVICES

A reminder for those who will be hunting in a group: <u>don't</u> <u>forget to bring small communication radios with you.</u>

They are very practical, as each of our guides has one and they allow you to stay in contact with them. They are essential for group hunting. They are now very reasonably priced and available at any sporting goods or electronics store.

They usually come in packs of two with a charger; choose the ones with the best range of 32 miles or more (50 km or more) model examples like Cobra, Uniden, or Midland.
